School updates 2023/04 (Secondary 4N)

1. Homework and Revision

It is imperative that students cultivate the habit of completing their homework on time in order to reinforce their learning in class and succeed in their studies. It is through homework that teachers are able to identify their students' learning gaps and address them as soon as possible. Please continue to work with us to cultivate in your child the habit of completing homework on time and revising his/her work regularly as he/she prepares for his assessments in Term 2.

2. Academic Consultation with Teachers

Students are encouraged to clarify their doubts with their subject teachers during lessons. In the event that they remain unclear after the lesson, they could arrange to meet with their teachers after school for consultation. Clarifications should be sought early so that misconceptions do not adversely affect learning in the future.

3. Secondary 4N Experiential Learning Programme

From 22 to 24 May 2023, the school will conduct an Experiential Learning Programme (ELP) for all Sec 4N students. The objective of this programme is to allow for learning in a differentiated and extended context beyond the physical space of the classroom.

Students will participate in different learning activities and the attire for students during ELP days will be PE T-shirt with skirt/pants. Students will report to school as per normal, by 7.20 am for the flag raising ceremony. All ELP programmes will end at 1.50 pm.
